REGISTRATION

Registration will be in the building just inside the entrance to Gate 3.

Please ensure that your crew and/or guests are aware of the Registration hours, they will need to receive their credentials prior to entering the facility. Each credential must be signed for by the individual to whom the credential is assigned.

Minors under the age of 16 may not be assigned Crew credentials.

STAGING AND LOAD-IN

- You may begin staging in Lot 3 on Monday, June 9. Please follow the directions of track personnel.
- Paddock Load-In will begin on Tuesday, June 10 at 12:00pm. If you arrive prior to load in time, you will be directed to Lot 3 for staging.
- The tunnel height is 13.5'. Vehicles that can use the tunnel may load-in from 12:00pm through the end of the day. Trucks and/or trailers that are too tall or have a low belly, will have to enter the paddock by crossing the track. Track Security personnel will coordinate track crossings.
- Truck and trailer combinations that can utilize the tunnel should do so. Semis and those that are too low to fit through the tunnel will cross the track during the lunch period (12pm – 12:45pm) and again at the end of day activities.
- Competitors paddocking in the garage area will not be able to load in until the end of the day as the garage area will be in use by that day's track renter.
- Please be respectful of your paddock neighbors. There are some power hook-ups available, these are all on a first come/first served basis and carry a \$50 charge. This is managed and collected by Track personnel.

PADDOCK AND GARAGE INFORMATION

- There is a \$50 fee to use the track's electricity. This is managed and collected by Track personnel. They will come by to collect this fee if you are plugged in to an outlet. Please cooperate with all track personnel.
- **Garages are assigned by HSR.** If your team has not been assigned a garage, please do not move into one ... you will be asked to move.
- Fire regulations prohibit propane tanks, empty or filled, in the two main paddock areas. If a team is bringing a travel trailer or motor home to use, the team must pit in the satellite compound paddock or D/O RV lot.
- **There is no fueling or running of engines inside a garage.** If a team needs to refuel or warm up an engine, the car must be moved outside of the garage stall to do so.
- Fire Extinguishers, provided by each team, shall be placed in every garage stall in case of emergency.
- No stakes may be driven into any asphalt or concrete.
- Do not argue with Watkins Glen International Security or other personnel.
- All waste must be disposed of properly.
- Used tires, batteries, equipment, and empty fuel drums are each individual team's responsibility. The simple rule is: If a team brought it in...then that team must take it out. Failure to do so could result in fines, suspensions, and increased costs for everyone.
- No open-toed shoes allowed in the Pit Lane area during endurance races.
- No shorts or sleeveless shirts are allowed in the Hot Pit Lane during endurance races.

TEST DAY:

There will be two (2) Mandatory Test Day Drivers' Meetings. One on Tuesday at 4:00pm and the second on Wednesday at 7:30am on the second floor of the Media Center. Each Test Day participant must attend one (1) of these two (2) meetings. If you wish to sign up for the Test Day Wednesday morning, please see Jack Woehrle at Tech. He will manually add you to the appropriate Test Day group.

TRACK ORIENTATION PROGRAM

HSR offers our Track Orientation Program at this event. Led by multiple championship-winning driver and HSR's Competition Director, Dorsey Schroeder, the Track Orientation Program offers those who are at Watkins Glen for the very first-time valuable insight that otherwise only comes with many miles of track time. The TOP will also provide the



returning competitor with a refresher course on this challenging racetrack. The TOP is conducted on the Test Day and requires an entry to the Test Day.

There is a mandatory Track Orientation Program Meeting at 7:30am on Wednesday, June 11 on the second floor of the Media Center.

ONLY those registered in the Track Orientation Program may participate in the Van Rides! No exceptions.

ENTRY DEADLINES:

The deadline to enter either of the B.R.M Chronographes Endurance Challenge races (one-hour Enduros) is 10am on Friday, June 13. You may enter either of the B.R.M Enduros after this time, but you will start at the back of the field. Contact Jack Woehrle in Tech or Registration to enter the B.R.M Enduro.

DRIVER/TEAM RVs

RVs that are parked in the Paddock may not have power available. If power is a necessity, you may purchase an RV camping pass from the track and park your RV in the RV Lot between Pit Lane and the Paddock. There are electrical and water hook-ups at this location. RV reservation is \$512 for the event. Please contact Madeleine Bush (mbush@nascar.com) to reserve your RV spot.

TECH:

Tech Inspection will be set up in Garages 1 and 30. You have all day Wednesday to get through Tech. All cars must present their Group Sticker on the Grid beginning Thursday morning.

The tech sheet for your entry will be at Tech. Your tech inspection must be completed to receive your Group Sticker(s). If you need to present your car for an annual tech inspection, please present your car with the car's logbook to the Tech Inspector. It is your responsibility to see that your car is prepared properly and safe to race.

DRIVERS' MEETINGS:

Attendance is mandatory! All drivers must attend one (1) of the two (2) Drivers' Meetings scheduled on Thursday, June 12 (9:00am and 11:00am). You will receive your helmet sticker at these meetings. If you miss both meetings, you must see Dorsey Schroeder for a review of the information covered at the meeting and to receive a helmet sticker.

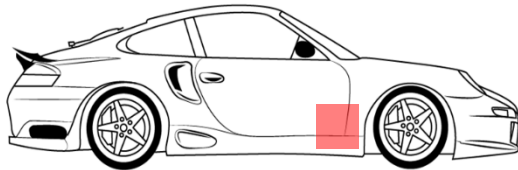

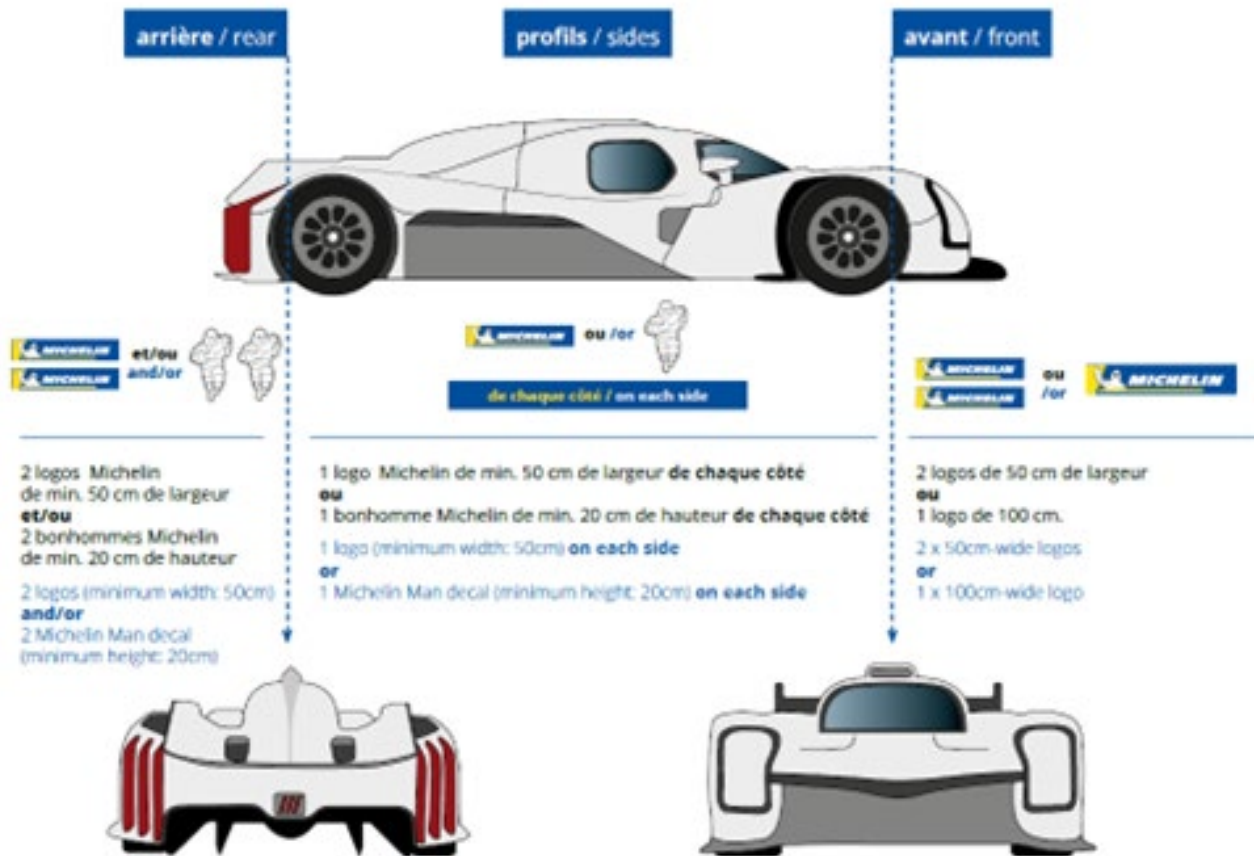

ELECTRIC BICYCLES AND SCOOTERS ARE PROHIBITED!

Pit vehicles must be operated at all times by a licensed driver who is 16 years of age or older. The speed limit is 10mph for all vehicles in Garage, Paddock, and Pit areas.

Personally owned golf carts may be operated in the **PADDOCK** and **PIT LANE** area **ONLY** and must be operated by a licensed driver who is 16 years of age or older. If a personally owned golf cart is taken into areas outside of the Paddock and Pit Lane area, certain other criteria need to be met. This includes registration of the golf cart with the track, payment of a fee, providing a certificate of insurance meeting the track standards (\$1,000,000 general liability, etc.).

WASTE DISPOSAL:

Waste oil or spent oil filter disposal locations can be found in various places in the Paddock and Garage areas. Please be sure you dispose of all items appropriately. Do not leave items (oil cans, tires, etc.) behind in your pit or in your paddock space.

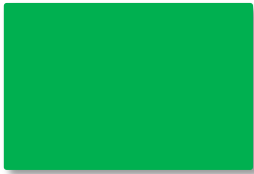

Racing Flags



Green Flag

Signals a clear course and indicates the immediate start or restart of a race.



Yellow Flag

STANDING: A situation exists that warrants your attention and caution. NO PASSING until you have proceeded to a station where the yellow flag is no longer being displayed.

WAVING: A hazardous situation exists that warrants your attention and extreme caution. SLOW DOWN AND NO PASSING. You will probably have to deviate from and modify your driving line.

DOUBLE: When you see a station displaying two yellow flags. A FULL COURSE YELLOW exists. NO PASSING, a pace car may be used.



Black Flag

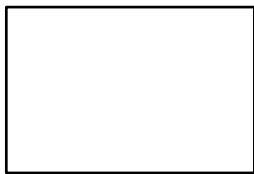
OPEN: Displayed at all corners means THE SESSION HAS STOPPED. All cars shall proceed cautiously to the pits. Stop Racing. An "ALL" sign will be displayed at the starter's stand and Black Flag Station. The Black Flag Station is located at Turn 6.

CLOSED (Furled): Warning when pointed at a participant from the starters stand.



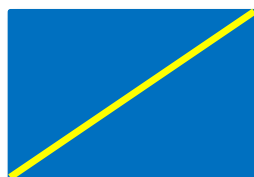
Red Flag

Session has been stopped. All cars should reduce speed to idle. Be prepared to stop. Give way to all emergency vehicles. If track is not blocked, proceed at idle speed back to pit lane, and park drivers right. No work can be done. Shut off engine and stay with your car, until told otherwise.



White Flag

Open, displayed at all corners and start, at the beginning of practice sessions. Passing allowed, you may encounter slower cars. Do not weave to warm tires.



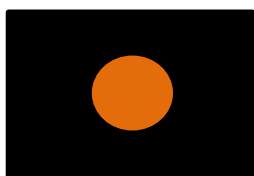
Blue w/ Yellow Stripe Flag

Check your mirrors. Hold the line, another competitor is following closely or is trying to overtake.



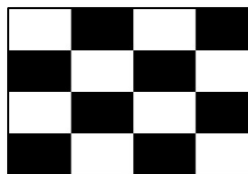
Yellow w/ Red Stripes Flag

Signals debris on race surface which could include parts from a car or a slippery race surface. Exercise caution.



Black w/ Orange Ball Flag

Do not take another lap. Something is wrong with a participant's car. Flag is shown beside board with involved car's number. That car must proceed to pits.



Checkered Flag

The race or session is finished. Stop racing, cool your car down and return to the pits at the next opportunity.
